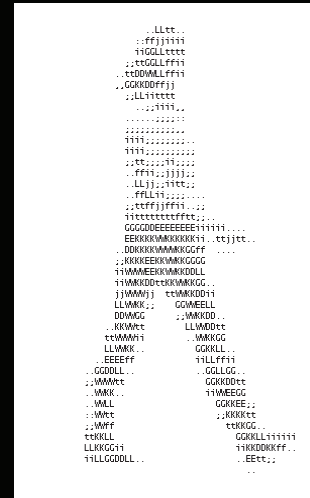

Dr. Hugo Heyrman is one of the pioneers of Net.art.¹ One of his most well known works is the collection of the Motions of the mind.² One example of Heyrman's net.art is a series of motion videos called (((motions of the mind))). This collection includes repetition videos that show animated images of the mind. Walking Woman, is one of the net art pieces from this collection and shows a 2D female silhouette, made of letters and numbers, walking in place but never stopping.

Another piece from the (((motions of the mind))) collection is No Fear of Death which shows a photo of Phillippe Petit walking a tightrope between the New York City Twin Towers in 1974.³ The photo flashes back and forth between the actual photo and an image of a skeleton showing the near death experience of the artist.
